sound musicianship. Led by trombonist Lenny Kellogg, they include Larry Lagerberg and/or Charlie Smith, trumpet; Clark Burnside, clarinet; Ray Leake, piano; Rory Thomas, banjo; Alan Sparks, bass; and Oscar DeZoto, drums. Drawing much of their

inspiration from Louis Armstrong and Jelly Roll Morton, they play a wide variety of traditional jazz, from ragtime through the classics of the twenties and thirties up to early swing. Whatever they play, their music is always upbeat and joyful.

Festival Return Hits Another Rocky Mountain High Note



After two Covid-forced postponements, the 19th Evergreen Jazz Festival made its comeback July 29-31 with over 80 hours of world-class jazz presented in the event's signature intimate venues.

But Covid still insisted on being a factor. After Midnight, one of the most popular bands ever to appear, had to cancel on Thursday when two members tested positive. Audience and organizers alike were very disappointed, but in the true spirit of jazz, improvisation came into play and the vacated sets were quickly filled. Certain members of the Queen City Jazz Band joined banjoist Maury Walker in the Something Doin' Big Little Ragtime Band and took three sets, Brian Holland and Danny Coots performed as their original duo for two, Louis Ford and His New Orleans Flairs took one, and clarinetist Lance Acker paired with former UC-D Claim Jumper, Justin Rogers, on piano to deliver a totally spontaneous fun-filled set.

It was readily apparent that patrons and musicians were happy to be back in Evergreen, and the BANDS seemed to deliver even more than expected. Louis Ford & His New Orleans Flairs were in the lineup for the first time since 2013, and audiences couldn't get enough of them. The Dalton

Ridenhour Trio from NYC was a big hit in their first Evergreen appearance, and other longtime favorites such as the Carl Sonny Leyland Trio, Joe Smith and The Spicy Pickles, and Queen City Jazz Band with Wende Harston, Your Father's Mustache, the Felonious Smith Trio and the Hot Tomatoes continued to thrill audiences.

Other highlights included dueling piano sets featuring Brian Holland, Carl Sonny Leyland and Dalton Ridenhour, the Sunday gospel service with the QCJB and Wende, Friday Dance Night at the Lake House, and daily free dance lessons with a Sunday bonus Charleston lesson.

Planning is now underway for next year's milestone 20th Festival July 28-30, and we expect it to be something very special! Check www.EvergreenJazz.org in January for the latest information.
