Hot Jazz, Pop Jazz, Hokum, Hilarity and History

There are some notable birthdays and other events that happened on our club meeting dates in January and February.

On January 16:



In 1930, saxophonist "Spike" Robinson was born in Kenosha, WI. A familiar player to many in metro Denver, Robinson worked around Denver for many years, ultimately moving to the UK, where he died in 2001.



In 1955, contemporary ragtime composer and pianist David Thomas Roberts was born in Mosspoint, MS. Roberts also works as a writer and visual artist, and has been writing a critical history of New Ragtime.

And the first jazz concert ever presented at New York's Carnegie Hall was held on January 16, 1938 by Benny Goodman.



On February 20:

In 1909, guitarist Oscar Alemán was born in Machagai, Argentina. After playing in Argentina, Brazil and Uruguay,



Alemán and his band toured Europe in 1929. He decided to stay in Europe, and moved to Paris, where he was hired by Josephine Baker to lead her band at the Cafe

de Paris. Alemán discovered American jazz through the music of Eddie Lang and Joe Venuti. He returned to Argentina during the Nazi invasion of Paris, where he became known as the most prominent Afro-Argentine and Argentine jazz musician. He passed away in 1980.



New Orleans born trumpeter Leroy Jones was born in 1958. As a child he played in a youth band led by veteran guitar/banjo player Danny Barker. In 1991, Jones joined the big band of Harry Connick, Jr., which jump-started his career.

One of the pioneers of boogie woogie, pianist Jimmy Yancey was born in Chicago around 1894. He began teaching himself to play the piano at the age of 15, and by 1915 had gained a sufficient profile to influence younger musicians, including Meade Lux Lewis and Albert Ammons. Yancey died in 1951.
